Terrior	The Graacher Domprobst" is the only vineyard from Dr. Heidemanns-Bergweiler which is not planted with Riesling. It provides excellent growing conditions for Spätburgunder. It was planted in 1986, making it one of the oldest Spätburgunder vineyards in the area. The soil is deep to medium-deep, and the weathered stony slate soil has clay content in the upper layer. A clay terrace underneath the 15-foot thick slate topsoil is conducive to a good channeling of water to the vineyard.	
Description	This Pinot Noir was fermented partly in new oak barrels and partly in used oak barrels. It has a nice aroma of plum and dark berries. Due to the combination with a slight touch of oak this Pinot Noir becomes smooth, fine red wine with medium body.	
Suggestion	Since it is a nice and fruity wine with some well integrated tannin, it can be used as an easy drinking companion for a long night.
